

## **Community & Region**

### The Roaring Fork Valley

Located in the Rocky Mountains of Colorado, the Roaring Fork Valley is made up of three counties, Pitkin, Eagle and Garfield. Within each of these communities is a mix of rural and urban areas, tied together by a common love of the outdoors. Geographically, these communities cover a good portion of central western Colorado.

Aspen is the county seat of Pitkin County, which has a year round population of 17,148 residents. During peak summer and winter seasons, residency can reach almost 50,000. A few miles away is the town of Snowmass Village; together with the City of Aspen, they are surrounded by mountains and known for skiing and having plenty of outdoor amenities year around. Some popular activities include hiking, golfing, biking, kayaking, fishing, skiing and many other water-based and snowy experiences.

The region is known for its nature and beauty. Some of the main attractions include the Maroon Bells National Forest and the world renowned resorts of Aspen Snowmass. The Elk Mountains sitting at over 14,000 feet feature tall peaks, hiking and climbing routes for the adventurer; it's known as one of the most photographed landscapes in North America. At Independence Pass, one of Colorado's highest paved roads in the state at 12,095 feet, you're able to go rock climbing. You can find a large flower garden and a tribute to Jon Denver engraved in the rocks at the John Denver Sanctuary, located right

next to Roaring Fork River. The area also offers an abundance of culture and entertainment thorugh the Aspen Institute, Wheeler Opera House, Aspen Music Festival, Food & Wine Festival, Snowmass Village Free Concerts and Festivals and a variety of other options.

As you can see, there is so much that the region has to offer, given its location and population. Areas of Pitkin County can be expensive; but further north of the City of Aspen, you'll find more affordable and available housing in both Eagle and Garfield Counties. Nearby communities include Woody Creek, Snowmass, Basalt, El Jebel, Carbondale and several others. Commuting from Carbondale to Aspen is approximately 45-55 minutes with good road conditions and up to an hour in winter conditions. Glenwood Springs is a bit further northwest along Highway 82; it is about an hour the from Aspen/Pitkin County Airport.



# Pitkin County & Airport (ASE)

Pitkin County is a home rule county operating under a five member Board of County Commissioners (BOCC). The BOCC appoints the County Manager who serves as the chief administrator of the organization. The BOCC also appoints the County Attorney. The County has 350 FTEs staffing 32 departments.

Pitkin County Administration recently completed construction of two new administrative facilities. In addition, the Sheriff's Office completed an expansion and remodel; and as part of the Pitkin County Healthy Rivers Project, a new kayak park was constructed.

ASE is a County-owned public-use airport with strong Community Values including a focus on safety, a warm and welcoming feel, environmental responsibility, and operational efficiency. It's served by both American Airlines and United Airlines. In 2019, the airport served just over 600,000 passengers with an 8,006 foot long runway 15/33. The airport is also serviced by Atlantic Aviation FBO.

There's quite a bit going on at the airport. For the next decade plus, the airport will walk the path toward achieving the BOCC's agreed Goals and Recommendations pinned as ASE Common Ground Recommendations. The 15 goals and recommendations outlined include everything from safety and sustainability at the airport to air service needs, ground connectivity, existing business focuses, and the overall travelers' experience, which includes facility usage and enhancements. These Common Ground Recommendations were part of an approximate 18-month ASE Visioning Process that include extensive community participation and support. As in the past, this will continue to be a standard as the airport moves forward into its new future.

Pitkin County as a whole is a professional place to work. The dress code is relaxed, and they strive to give their employees a work life balance through flexible work hours when needed. Ski breaks are encouraged (or bike rides or runs) as long as you get your work done. If you can go out for an hour during the day and make up the time - go for it! They manage through being compassionate and supportive, by listening, and being solutions focused. Who wouldn't want to be a part of this organization?













## **The Position**

### Finance Manager

In a newly envisioned reporting structure, the Finance Manager will report to the Deputy Director of Finance at Pitkin County. This position will support, oversee and manage the airport enterprise fund along with general oversight and support of other County Funds including Public Works, Road & Bridge, Open Space & Trails, Library, Radio and Solid Waste. The expected airport work in comparison to other funds is 75% and 25% respectively. With a strong focus on airport financials, the incoming Finance Manager will have the ability to broaden their financial base by supporting other County funds.

The Finance Manager will be expected to handle the day-to-day fiscal aspects at the airport. This person will plan, organize, direct and coordinate the administrative and technical accounting, and financial functions of the airport and other fund accounts as noted. General duties include but are not limited to daily operations and processes for accounts payable, accounts receivable and payroll; financial management and reporting, auditing and fiscal management, evaluation and development of rates and charges and general contract oversight support duties as they relate to regulations governing airports and other funds. A keen understanding and expertise in FAA Grant regulations, policies, and procedures will be necessary for this position. Those with knowledge of other grant funding sources will be helpful, but with the County's support, a working knowledge would be sufficient. This position will also be responsible for ensuring compliance with state, federal and other regulatory matters and be expected to grow into the subject matter expert for the Pitkin County. A successful applicant for this position will have a strong understanding and application of GAAP and GASB accounting rules, enterprise fund management, project accounting, grant funding cycles, reimbursement cycles, a working knowledge of CARES ACT funding, and general state grant-type funding.

The County seeks a collaborative leader who focuses on relationships, agility and solution-based decisionmaking. This person will need to work with both airport and county customers by building a solid bridge between the two as they bridge the divisions together. To achieve success with this, the person will need to be confident enough to ask questions and seek assistance when need. Having an ability to think independently while working through tough situations but resolve situations collaboratively will be instrumental for the incoming person. A general understanding and ability to troubleshoot work matters and applying innovative thinking to achieve overall success would fit in with the division's mindset. As a manager and leader, this person will need to evaluate objectively, formulate potential solutions and communicate matters and ideas well with their reporting team members, their supervisor and the fund directors they are working with. Therefore, having an ability to communicate confidently with different audiences, recommend and gain buy-in to responsible solutions and lead this position's respective customers toward right business decisions is necessary. A general understanding and working knowledge of how to evaluate and develop reporting team members as well as resolving internal matters will be important for this role. There are County support systems in place to support this role if additional knowledge and understanding are needed, but this person will need to be able to understand their own limits and seek quidance when necessary.

## **Education & Experience**

A bachelor's degree with major coursework in accounting, finance or business administration with a minor or focus in accounting or finance is desired. At least five (5) years of accounting or finance work with a focus on airport/aviation experience and one to three (1-3) years of supervision are required. Applicants with an intermediate and above level of experience with spreadsheets are necessary for success. Lastly, the ability to obtain a Colorado Driver's License will be required for the role.

An advanced degree and/or certification as a CPA and other industry certifications are preferred.
